

Truth 8

Man must repent (change his mind/ heart about living a self-centered life) and believe that Jesus can both remove his sin and fill his life with His very presence in order to have a meaningful relationship with God.

Acts 20:20, 21; Romans 10:8-13

Have you ever considered that you don't have the best plan for this life or for the next to come? Living for the moment may be fun, but is it fulfilling? Is there an emptiness that you can't fill no matter how hard you try? Does it feel that something or *someone* is missing in your life? Repentance is a change of heart and mind from living a self-centered life to beginning to love and obey God; and realizing you can't do it yourself.

Truth 9

God will restore man to the condition he originally planned in creation and will establish an ongoing (eternal) intimate relationship of fellowship and worship with him that will make him complete and whole.

*John 10:9, 10; 14:23; Romans 8:31-39
Galatians 5:22, 23; Ephesians 3:17-19*

Have you ever considered that there is more to this life and the next than you have experienced? Could there truly be genuine love, genuine joy, genuine peace to be experienced in this life? There can and there is - in Jesus Christ.

Through the grace of God, He is able to make a new life in you - His life! (Romans 5:10) a life that will not be meaningless.

Truth 10

Those who choose not to receive the gift of life through Jesus Christ will live lonely separated from God and others for all eternity in unbearable suffering.

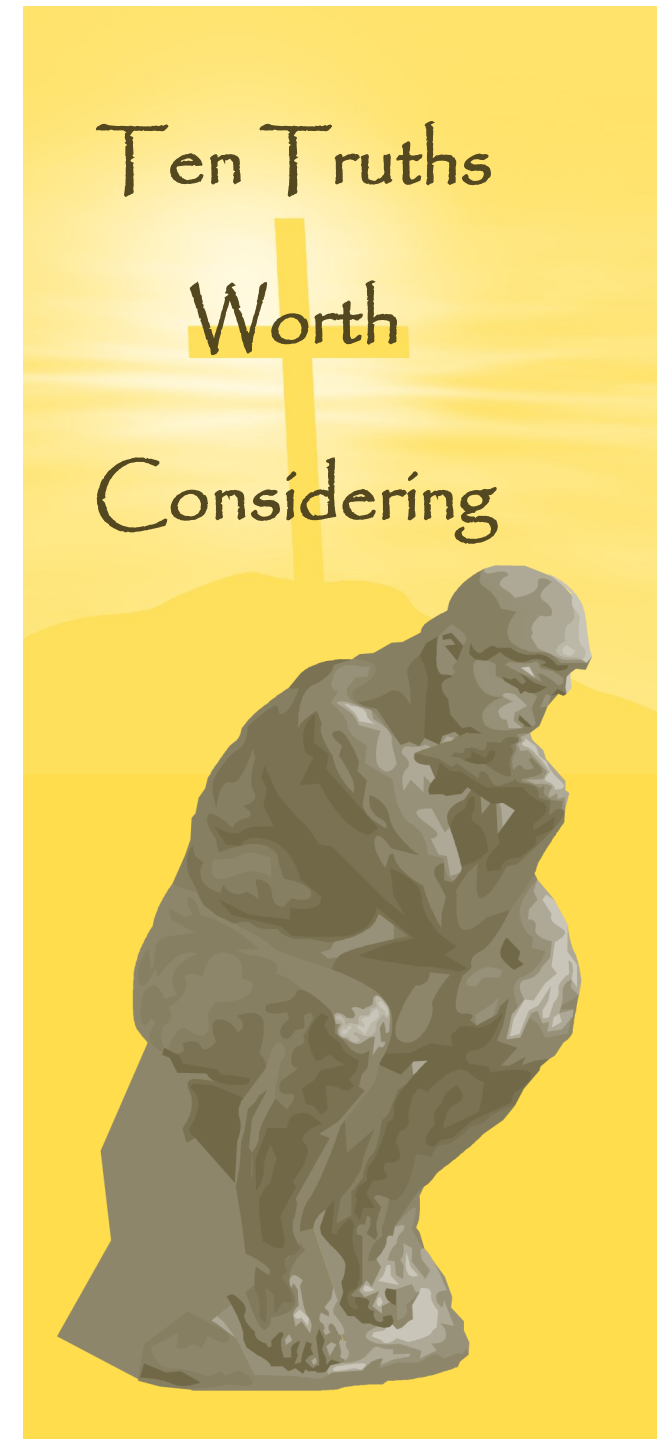
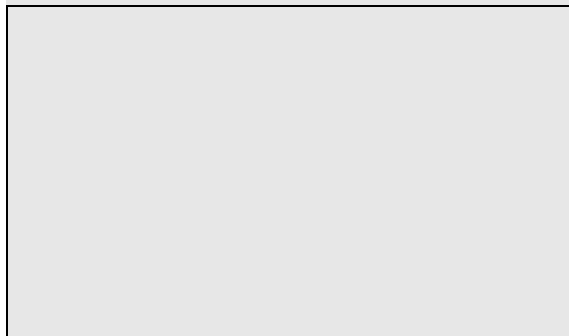
*Proverbs 27:20; Matthew 7:22, 23

Truth 1

God made man in order to have a meaningful relationship with him. This was to be an intimate relationship of fellowship and worship that would make man complete and whole.

Genesis 1:26 - 31; Psalm 139:13 - 18; Revelation 4:11; Romans 11:36

Have you ever considered that God wanted to know you more than anything else He created? That is why he made man different than all the other creatures. We were made to know God - not just know about Him.

Truth 2

Man believed the lie that he could have a meaningful life apart from God.

Genesis 3:1-7; John 8:44

Have you ever considered which is worst - to tell a lie or to believe a lie? When Adam and Eve acted on a lie - they lost everything. What lies might you be believing?

Truth 3

Man exchanged his relationship with God for a life of self-centered meaningless activity through sin.

Romans 1:22 - 25

Have you ever considered what life would be like if there were no consequences for our actions? Adam and Eve wanted to believe that they could live a life apart from God where they could decide for themselves what was right and wrong and they could make their own decisions and that no bad would come of it. They were wrong.

Truth 4

Now all men are born separated from God and bent on self-destruction because of sin.

Genesis 5:3; Romans 3:10, 23; 5:12 - 19; Romans 6:23; James 1:14, 15

Have you ever considered why babies do not have to be taught how to lie? Before we can form words, we do what is necessary to get our way. That is because of the nature we are all born with since Adam's sin. Left to ourselves - we naturally choose wrong over right. It is just the way we are. All wrong results in something dying - especially in relationships.

Truth 5

Jesus came as the God/man to restore the broken relationship between man and his creator.

John 1:1-12; 3:16; Colossians 1:15-20; Hebrews 1:1-3; 1 Timothy 2:3-6

Have you ever considered what made Jesus different from every other religious leader? He didn't claim to know how to get to God - He actually was God! If He were only man, He would have been tainted by the same sin that affects you and me. If He were God only appearing to be a man, He could not have suffered the death necessary to pay for that sin.

In his coming, Jesus also demonstrated by His life what man should be like - reflecting the image and the glory of God by what He said and did.

His life proved He was God - His death proved He was man. His resurrection proved He is Lord.

Truth 6

Jesus removed the barrier of separation between man and God (sin and death) through His own death and resurrection.

Romans 5:6-8; Colossians 2:13-15; Ephesians 2:14-16; Hebrews 12:2

Have you ever considered why Jesus died on a cross even when he had done nothing to deserve it? He did it for you! He loved you so much that there was no price too high to gain the opportunity to get to know you. The joy of the prospect of knowing you was greater than the pain of dying for you. Sin had to be paid for before our relationship to God could be restored.

The death of Christ removed the sin from before God. The resurrection of Christ restored the image and glory to man.

Truth 7

Man may receive the relationship he lost with God through Jesus Christ (and Jesus Christ only).

John 14:6; 17:1-3; Acts 4:10-12; Philippians 2:9-11; 1 John 5:11-13

Have you ever considered that Jesus may actually be the ONLY way to know God? There may be many planes leaving an airport and they all look similar, but if one gets on the wrong plane - it will *not* take him where he thinks he wants to go even if he insists. You must board at the right gate to get on the right plane to go to the right place, regardless of what you want to think. What did Jesus say? (*John 14:6*) That is not narrow minded - it's just a narrow way, and few are those who take it. (*Matthew 7:14*)
