WHAT IS THE GOLDEN OFFERING FOR TENNESSEE MISSIONS?



- ★ The state missions offering provides funds for ministries that help reach Tennesseans for Christ.
- ★ The Golden Offering is collected all year with a special emphasis on giving and praying for state missions during the month of September.
- ★ The Golden Offering for Tennessee Missions works in conjunction with the Cooperative Program to effectively meet needs and to support ministries in Tennessee.
- ★ The Golden Offering for Tennessee Missions is:
 - ★ Meeting human needs through Compassion Ministries.
 - ★ Disaster Relief volunteers helping restore communities after a natural disaster.
 - ★ Baptist Collegiate Ministries sharing the hope of Jesus on Tennessee college campuses.
 - ★ Church planting across Tennessee where there is no gospel witness.
 - ★ English taught to someone from another country, sharing Jesus with them in the process, and so much more!
- ★ Brief history:
 - ★ In 1902, Dr. W.C. and Mildred Golden led Tennessee Baptists to become the first state to have a season of prayer and special offering for state missions.
 - ★ Mrs. Golden served as Tennessee WMU Corresponding Secretary from 1898-1902. Dr. Golden served as State Missions Secretary.
 - \star The first offering was \$800.
 - ★ The offering was named after Dr. W.C. and Mildred Golden in 1943.

★ MAKE IT PERSONAL ★

- ★ Use the Any Way You Slice It, Tennessee is a Mission Field flyers to share information that highlights why Tennessee is a mission field.
- ★ Share testimonies from people in your church who have participated in or benefitted from a ministry supported by the Golden Offering. Examples:
 - ★ Someone who serves as a Disaster Relief volunteer or who was ministered to by a Disaster Relief volunteer.
 - ★ Someone who volunteers through Compassion Ministries, Baptist Collegiate Ministries, Christian Job Corps or other GOTM funded ministry.
 - ★ Someone who received a Tennessee WMU Scholarship.
- ★ Associational Ministries 15% of whatever a church gives through GOTM will be returned to the association with which the church is affiliated. There are no restrictions on how the association spends the money, but it is requested that they apply it to ministries that support people being saved, baptized and discipled. Check with your Association Missions Strategist/Director of Missions to see how these funds are being used in your association.







PREACHING/SPEAKING/TEACHING OUTLINE

"LOVE BEARS, BELIEVES, HOPES, ENDURES"

TITLE: THE MOUNT RUSHMORE OF LOVE SCRIPTURE: 1 CORINTHIANS 13:7

Introduction:

Introduce the concept of "Mount Rushmore"

- ★ Mount Rushmore National Memorial is a famous monument in South Dakota, USA. It features the 60-foot-tall heads of four American presidents: George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Theodore Roosevelt and Abraham Lincoln, carved into the granite face of Mount Rushmore in the Black Hills region. The monument was sculpted by Gutzon Borglum and his son Lincoln Borglum between 1927 and 1941.
- ★ The term "Mount Rushmore" is also used metaphorically to refer to a top four ranking in various categories, often in sports or pop culture. People have created their own lists of Mount Rushmore's in the areas of sports. Who's on the Mount Rushmore of Point Guards? Who's your quarterback on Mount Rushmore?
- ★ In 1 Corinthians 13, you could say that Paul gives us the Mount Rushmore of Love. These aren't people but attributes of what true, godly, sacrificial love looks like.

I. Love Bears All Things

- 1. Definition and Explanation
 - ★ Explain "bearing" as supporting, carrying and enduring difficulties.
- 2. Application
 - ★ Encourage the congregation to bear each other's burdens (Galatians 6:2).
 - ★ In Tennessee: Pull a few facts from the "Your GOTM Dollars at Work" PDF to communicate the needs and crises our state is facing.
 - ★ In Church: Share practical ways to support one another in times of trouble.
- 3. Gospel Thread
 - ★ Reflect on God's love in bearing our sins through Christ's sacrifice.

II. Love Believes All Things

- 1. Definition and Explanation
 - ★ Define "believes" as having faith and trust.
 - ★ Discuss how love always looks for the best in others and maintains trust.
- 2. Application
 - ★ Challenge the congregation to trust in God's promises and in each other.
 - ★ Address the importance of fostering trust in relationships.
- 3. Gospel Thread
 - ★ The Gospel is as Simple as Acts 16:31! "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved you and your household."





PREACHING/SPEAKING/TEACHING OUTLINE

III. Love Hopes All Things

- 1. Definition and Explanation
 - ★ Define "hopes" as the confident expectation of what God has promised and its strength is in His faithfulness.
 - ★ Explain that love remains optimistic and looks forward to a positive future.
- 2. Application
 - ★ Encourage maintaining hope even in challenging circumstances.
 - ★ Discuss the role of hope in personal growth and in community building.
 - ★ Share that through the Golden Offering for Tennessee Missions, we are expressing the hope of the gospel in a number of ways including these five:
 - A. Meeting human needs through Compassion Ministries.
 - B. Disaster Relief volunteers helping restore communities after a natural disaster.
 - C. Baptist Collegiate Ministries sharing the hope of Jesus on Tennessee college campuses.
 - D. Church planting across Tennessee where there is no gospel witness.
 - E. English taught to someone from another country and sharing Jesus with them in the process.
- 3. Gospel Thread
 - ★ Reflect on the hope we have in Christ's return and eternal life (Titus 2:13).

IV. Love Endures All Things

- 1. Definition and Explanation
 - ★ Define "endures" as remaining steadfast under suffering or hardship without yielding. Read the following story as an example of endurance.

Corrie Ten Boom's family lived in Holland in 1943. Germany had invaded their country as the Nazis took control of most of Europe. Corrie and her family could have helped the Nazis and been rewarded, but they didn't. In her words, "I had been sick for several days with a bad case of the flu. The high fever made me sleepy, so I stayed in bed, hoping to feel better in the morning. But I was awakened by screams and the sound of feet rushing toward my room. At first, I thought it was one of the many drills we had practiced to hide the Jews who now lived with my family. But this time it was not a drill. German soldiers were raiding our home, looking for the Jewish people that they had heard were hiding. Instantly, I leaped from my bed to help our guests hurry into the secret space that had been built inside a wall in my room. Once they were inside, I quickly closed the hidden door to the safe place and slipped back into bed. I pretended to be fast asleep. As soon as my eyes were closed, the soldiers rushed into my room; they forced me to get out of bed and get dressed. They wanted to know where the Jews were. But neither my sister nor I would tell them. We were slapped and hit by the soldiers. Blood trickled down our swollen faces, but we were willing to die rather than tell where they were. The Nazi soldiers punched holes in the walls looking for the hiding place, but they couldn't find it. My family, including my 84-year-old father, was handcuffed and forced to march into the dark night to the police station." Ask: How does our endurance compare to that of Corrie's?

- 2. Application
 - ★ Encourage perseverance in relationships, faith and trials.
 - ★ Share stories of enduring love from the church community.
- 3. Gospel Thread
 - ★ Reflect on God's enduring love for humanity throughout history.

Conclusion and Invitation:

- ★ Emphasize that these Mount Rushmore qualities are interconnected and essential for a Christ-like love.
- ★ Invite those who have never experienced the love of Christ to commit to follow Him today.
