

How Can My Church Become A Multiplying Church In Tennessee?

- 1. Pray that God will give a burden for unreached-underreached people and areas of our state.
- 2. Determine where God may lead you to be involve in planting a new church.
 - a. Contact your local association about possible church plant opportunities.
 - b. Contact the Healthy Church Multiplication Team of the TBMB about priority church planting areas around the state.
 - c. Prayerfully consider where God may be leading you to plant, replant or campus.
- 3. Decide Your Level of Commitment:
 - a. <u>Mother/Sending Church:</u> A mother/sending church partners with a new church plant in prayer, participation, and/or provision, taking responsibility for the plant, replant, or campus until she is self-sustaining, self-governing, and self-propagating.
 - b. **Partner Church:** A partnering church comes alongside a sending church to support a church plant by praying, participating, and/or providing resources.
 - c. <u>Church Planting Coalition:</u> A church planting coalition is a group of churches that collaborate with a mother/sending church to provide short term resources and support to a church plant or replant.
- 4. Plan a commitment day where your church will pray and make a commitment to be a church multiplication church.
- 5. Participate in "Churches Planting Churches" to help your church develop a strategy to plant a healthy reproducing multiplying church.
- 6. Pray that God will lead you to a church planter or raise up a church planter and church planting team from your church.
 - a. Do a background check and assessment of your planter. Contact Healthy Churches Multiplication team about assessment process.
 - b. Work with Healthy Churches Multiplication Team to help train and develop your planter and church planting team.
- 7. Determine the time to commission and send out your church planting team to plant.
- 8. Maintain a guiding and nurturing relationship with your plant so they can grow to be self-leading, self-supporting, and self-multiplying.
