

# PASTOR'S SERMON PROMPTS: TOGETHER WE PRAY, GIVE & GO

Scripture Focus: Mark 2:1-12

#### **OPENING THEME**

Golden Offering for Tennessee Missions Theme: "Together: We Pray. We Give. We Go."

Key Truth: When Jesus is in the HOUSE, Everything Changes.

## **SCRIPTURE READING: MARK 2:1-12**

Location: Jesus entered CAPERNAUM after some days.

The Crowd: So many people gathered that there was no longer room to receive them, not even near the DOOR.

The Need: Four men brought a PARALYTIC to Jesus.

The Problem: They could not come near Jesus because of the CROWD.

The Solution: They UNCOVERED the roof and let down the bed.

Jesus' Response: "When Jesus saw their FAITH, he said to the paralytic, 'Son, your SINS are forgiven you."

## **THREE MAIN POINTS**

- 1. The PRESENCE of the Master
  - A. Jesus was "in the HOUSE"
  - B. There was an atmosphere of EXCITEMENT and EXPECTANCY
  - C. The most important thing we have is the **POWER** and **PRESENCE** of the Lord Jesus *Discussion Point*: How do you prepare your heart to meet with Jesus?
- 2. The PARTNERSHIP of the Men
  - A. FOUR men carried their paralyzed friend
  - B. They were PERSISTENT, CREATIVE and COLLABORATIVE
  - C. They would not take NO for an answer
  - D. Every obstacle became an **OPPORTUNITY**

Key Principle: We can do MORE together than any single one of us can do alone.

Application Point: Who in your life needs you to help get them close to Jesus?

- 3. The PRIORITY of the Ministry
  - A. Jesus dealt with the PRIMARY issue first
  - B. The paralytic's SINS were forgiven before his body was healed
  - C. Only GOD can forgive sins

Jesus' Words: "Son, your sins are FORGIVEN you."

The Challenge: "I saw to you, ARISE, take up your BED and go to your house."

# THE CRITICS VS. THE HELPERS

- 1. The Scribes:
  - A. They were **SITTING** there (not helping)
  - B. They criticized instead of CELEBRATING
  - C. They questioned: "Who can forgive sins but GOD alone?"
- 2. The Lesson: We need COOPERATION, not criticism.

#### **GOSPEL APPLICATION**

Luke 19:10 - Jesus' Mission: "The Son of Man has come to SEEK and to SAVE those who were lost." The Call: Everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord shall be SAVED.

**2 Corinthians 5:17:** "If any man is in Christ, he is a NEW creation. Old things pass away, and all things become NEW."



#### **TENNESSEE MISSIONS CONNECTION**

Current Need: Nearly 5 MILLION people in Tennessee need to be saved.

What They Need: Friends who will not take NO for an answer and will do whatever it takes to get them close to Jesus.

Our Response: Creative GIVING, creative GOING, and creative SERVING

# **KEY SERMON PHRASES TO EMPHASIZE**

- "When Jesus is in the house, everything changes"
- "We are always better together"
- "Don't ever give up in your prayers"
- · "Without faith, it's impossible to please God"
- "Only God can forgive sins" (acknowledge the scribes were right)
- · "Get up! Get off that bed where you've been lying your whole life"
- · "There is no sinner too far away that God's grace can't reach them"

#### TRANSITION PHRASES

- 1. Moving to Partnership: "Now what was going on outside and up on the roof was one bit of the story..."
- 2. Moving to Priority: "Jesus dealt with the primary issue first..."
- 3. Moving to Application: "Brothers and sisters, we're living in a state that has a lot of lost people in it..."

## PERSONAL CHALLENGE QUESTIONS TO ASK

- "Who do you know that needs your invitation?"
- "Who needs you to go and invite them?"
- "How can you find creative ways to get your friend near to Jesus?"
- "Who in your life is paralyzed maybe not physically, but emotionally or spiritually?"

#### **CLOSING PRAYER FOCUS**

- Thank God for sending JESUS
- Pray for those who are FAR FROM GOD
- · Ask God to help us be faithful in sharing the GOSPEL
- Pray for Tennessee Baptist churches to **WORK TOGETHER Final Reminder:** There is no sinner too **FAR** away that God's grace can't reach them.

#### **KEY STATISTICS/FACTS TO MENTION**

- This story appears THREE TIMES in the Gospels (Matthew 9, Mark 2, Luke 5)
- · Capernaum was a small fishing village on the Sea of Galilee
- Jesus had been there before ("again he entered Capernaum")
- The roof was made of tiles and thatch that could be removed
